Is It In Season?

Our quiz on page 29 shows three different items of produce you could find in most supermarkets right now. But are asparagus, peppers, and blood oranges actually in season now in California, or are they being shipped in from far away? Here are our answers:

Asparagus: Yes, now is asparagus season and it's grown very nearby. If you shop at a farmers market, the asparagus you'll find might be from Brentwood growers Cecchini & Cecchini. Also look for asparagus from Zuckerman Farms in Stockton, Barbagelata Farms in Linden, Couture Farm in Kettleman City, and Halong Farms in Merced.

Peppers: No, it's not pepper season in California. Peppers need hot weather to develop, and so you won't find local peppers until late in the summer growing season.

Blood Oranges: Many citrus varieties and species ripen in winter, and the trees are very popular with home gardeners in California, so you'll see loaded trees all around your neighborhood right now. Blood oranges have a long season and this is a good time to find them coming in to the farmers markets from growers such as Lone Oak Ranch in Reedley, Schletewitz Family Farm in Sanger, and Hamada Farms in Kingsburg (south of Fresno).
